Attention H2Ohio producers, it's time to turn in documentation for verification to get paid for your conservation practices! Once all documentation is turned in and verified, payments will start being made for 2026!

- Nutrient Management (Basic: \$10/ac.; Precision: \$15/ac.):

All Nutrient Management Info: 578 Form, As-Applied Maps, Bills, Scale Tickets, Invoices

- Placement (\$20/ac.):

As-Applied Maps, Bills, Scale Tickets

- Manure Incorporation (Dry: \$35/ac.; Liquid: \$60/ac.):

Application/Incorporation Dates, Application Rates, Weather Reports

- Cover Crops (\$40/acre):

578 Form, Seed Tags/ Analysis, Invoices

Other Reminders

- If you grow your own seed used for overwintering cover crops, it must be tested prior to planting (including: % purity, % germ., % weed seed, Ohio noxious weed content).
- Bin run seed with test results showing noxious weed seed must be cleaned and resampled.

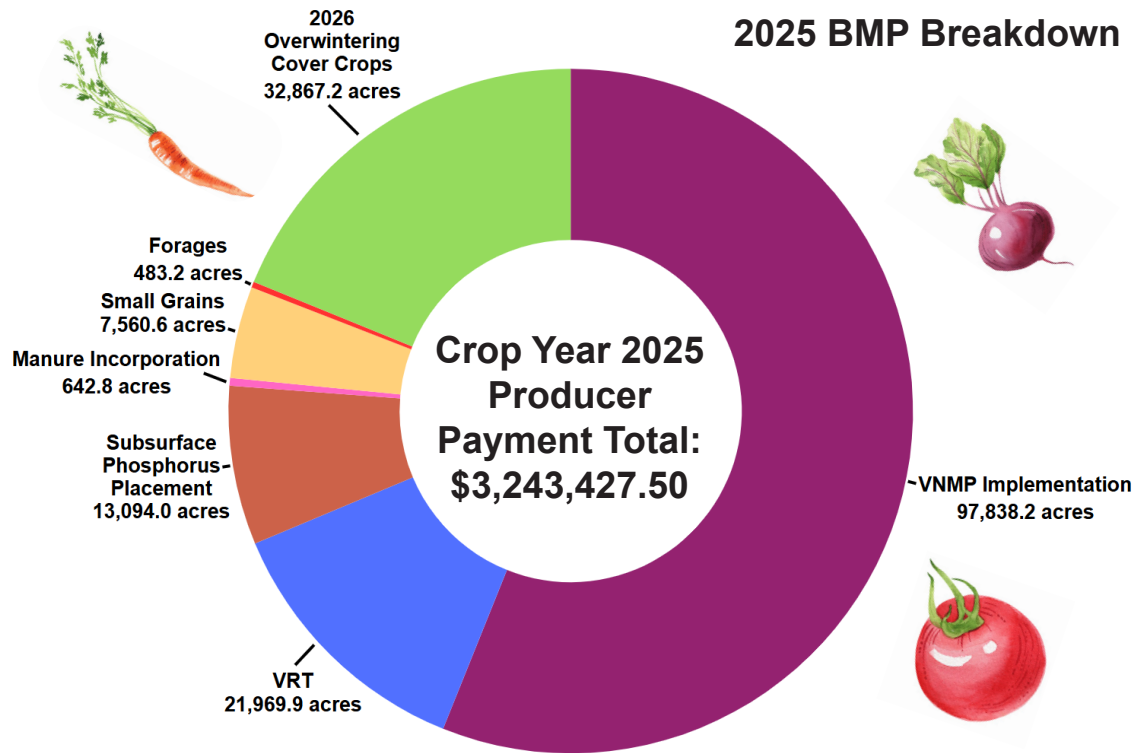
Fun Facts

- "Sandusky" is derived from the Wyandot word *saandustee* meaning "cold water."
- Fremont is the home and burial site of Rutherford B. Hayes, 19th president of the United States, who served from 1877 to 1881.
- The county served as a vital transit corridor for the Underground Railroad, as freedom seekers escaping enslavement utilized the Sandusky River and local roadways to reach major ports on Lake Erie and gain passage into Canada.

Sandusky County's Role in America 250

Before European settlement, the area which would eventually become known as the City of Fremont went by another name: the Wyandot village of Junquindundeh.

Per the Treaty of Greenville in 1795, nearly two-thirds of modern-day Ohio and strategic locations throughout were ceded to the government for military use and settlement.

Fort Stephenson was a prominent line of defense in the War of 1812. On August 2nd, 1813, it was defended courageously by Major George Croghan against the British and Indigenous forces over the span of a two-day siege.

After the war in 1815, a small village began to grow up around the fort due to prospective settlers and in January of 1820, the Ohio Legislature established Sandusky County.
